ASVAB

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) will be offered on campus on Friday, Oct. 26 from 8 to 11:30 a.m. in the Kalaheo Library. Students interested in enlisting in the military need to take the ASVAB in order to enlist. All students in grades 10, 11 and 12 are welcome to take the ASVAB. We do not release ASVAB scores to military recruiters. Sign up in H208 until Oct. 19th.

PSAT Ticket Sales

The PSAT (preliminary SAT) will be offered on campus Wed., Oct. 17, 2012 from 8 am to 11:30 am. The PSAT is a standardized test that provides firsthand practice for the SAT. Students in grades 9, 10 and 11 can take the PSAT. It measures critical reading skills, math problem-solving skills and writing skills. Juniors will be entered into the National Merit Scholarship program based on this exam score. Cost to purchase a PSAT ticket is \$15 CASH only in the College & Career Center between now and September 21. For more information on the PSAT, visit www.collegeboard.com/psat.

SAT and ACT 2012-2013

To register for either the ACT or SAT, students must create their "login" and "password" for each test. Students register online, paying with a credit card. When asked for the high school code, **Kalaheo High School's Code is**120143 for both tests.

Students can **send their test scores to four colleges for free** and are encouraged to do so. Scores released AF-TER the testing dates may incur a cost per each release.

Fee waivers are available to juniors and seniors who are eligible for free/reduced lunch. Be sure to submit the necessary paperwork with Kalaheo High School. See Ms. Inouye if you have any questions.


Hawaii Future Physicians Symposium



Elementary School Leaders Gather for Kalaheo Complex Leadership Camp

Student leaders from six schools gathered for the annual Kalaheo Complex Leadership Camp from August 22-24 at YMCA Camp Erdman in Mokuleia. About 80 participants from Aikahi Elementary, Kailua Elementary, Kainalu Elementary, Lanikai Elementary, Kailua Intermediate, and Kalaheo High Schools attended the leadership training. This year's theme was "Peace, Love, Leadership."

Elementary school leaders attended workshops on how to run meetings, plan activities, build teamwork, and strengthen communication. Participants also brainstormed and prioritized ideas for a complex service project to be completed by the end of the school year by all six participating schools. Student leaders also learned how to trust one another and work together to achieve school goals. Each elementary school had the opportunity to create SMART goals and brainstorm ideas for activities for their schools.

The leadership camp was planned and facilitated by high school and intermediate school leaders. With the guidance of Mr. Richard Lau, advisor from Kalaheo High, and Mr. Bill Budenholzer, advisor from Kailua Intermediate, facilitators taught participants important leadership skills necessary for a successful year. Facilitators from Kalaheo included Chairperson Hannah Carnes, Juenea Dement, Marcella Gallo, Tristin Makham, Anisia Paisley, and Helena Stevenson.

"These have been the best three days of my life," said Marcella Gallo. "It ran really smoothly because of how well we were trained."



DRESS CODE GUIDELINES (revised 7/12)

Students will come to school clean and well-groomed in appropriate clothing to promote a positive learning environment. Administrators, faculty, and staff will refer any dress that is deemed inappropriate to the Health Room to change into a DCV t-shirt or call home to obtain acceptable clothing based on the following guidelines:

- 1. All tops must have attached shoulder straps. No tube tops or bustier tops are permitted.
- Cleavage, chests, backs, and midriffs must be completely covered with clothing. Exposure of these areas of the body is prohibited. Males must wear their shirts at all times. Students are not permitted to wear low-cut, transparent, or cut-out clothing.
- 3. Shorts and skirts must be at mid-thigh length. Exposure of the buttocks region is prohibited.
- 4. Wearing sunglasses and hoods are prohibited in the classroom.
- All tops must have neutral or positive messages. Articles of clothing, jewelry, and accessories that contain any reference to negative social issues, drugs, sex, profanity, pornography, weapons, and gangs are prohibited.
- Underwear is not permitted as outerwear. No tank style undershirts or boxer shorts are permitted.
- Footwear must be worn at all times. Students must adhere to classroom lab policy for safe footwear.
