The "Redesigned" SAT

The redesigned SAT will be launched in Spring 2016! The redesigned SAT will focus on the knowledge and skills that current research shows are most essential for college and career readiness and success. The exam will reflect the best of class work. The Eight Key changes to the SAT include: relevant words in context, command of evidence, essay analyzing a source, focus on math that matters most, problems grounded in real-world contexts, analysis in science and in history/social studies, founding documents and great global conversation, and no penalty for wrong answers. SAT and ACT 2014-2015 and 2015-2016

To register for either the ACT or SAT, students must create their "login" and "password" for each test. Students register online, paying with a credit card. When asked for the high school code, **Kalaheo High School's Code is 120143 for both tests.** Students are encouraged to send their scores to four colleges for free at the time of registration. Scores released AFTER testing may incur a cost per each release.

NEW- For both the SAT and ACT, you must upload your headshot photo AT THE TIME OF registration. Read the instructions to ensure the correct type of photo.

.Fee waivers are available to juniors and seniors who are eligible for free/reduced lunch. Be sure to submit the necessary paperwork with Kalaheo High School to determine your eligibility. See Ms. Inouye in H-208, if you have any questions.

Highlights from the graduation packet that Seniors received in February:

The commencement ceremony will be held on **Tuesday**, **June 2**, **2015** at **6:30** p.m. at the Neal Blaisdell Concert Hall. Participation in the commencement service is a privilege and a voluntary co-curricular activity that is sponsored by the class.

In order to participate in the graduation ceremony on June 2, seniors must fulfill all graduation requirements of the Department of Education for the State of Hawaii by May 28, 2015.

Ceremony to follow

Students must make arrangements to be at these rehearsals. Graduates will lose 1 ticket for every 5 minutes they are late to rehearsal.

On Tuesday the graduates will be bussed from Kalaheo to the Blaisdell for rehearsal. Graduates must bring everything they need for the ceremony. The bus leaves Kalaheo at 11:45 a.m. Students will be served dinner around 4:30 p.m. and will have plenty of time to get dressed for the ceremony. Students may not leave the Blaisdell for any reason!

Graduation Tickets

Graduation tickets will be given out at Graduation rehearsals and will only be given to the graduate. Each graduate will get 10 tickets. Admission to the ceremony is by ticket only. There is no limit to the number of guests that can greet the graduates on the lawn after the ceremony.

Ceremony Expectations

Please notify your guests that <u>air horns and laser pointers are not allowed</u> during the ceremony. Guests who use such items and those who exhibit inappropriate behavior will be removed by security and/or police from the ceremony. Enforcement of this rule will allow each family to hear the name of their specific graduate read as they walk across the stage.

Large signs are not be allowed in the Concert Hall.

Graduation Dress Code

GIRLS:

- A. A **dress** shorter than the graduation gown (or a skirt and blouse). We recommend a simple dress with short sleeves or sleeveless.
- B. **Black dress shoes**. No casual footwear such as tabbies, slippers, or athletic shoes are allowed. For safety, heels may not exceed 2 inches.



BOYS:

- A. Black dress pants. No jeans.
- B. Plain white or light colored **collared dress shirt with short** sleeves. No aloha shirts or printed shirts.

To show class unity, no leis, flowers, or other accessories may be worn during the ceremony.



"Students shall be permitted to participate in commencement exercises if they (1) meet the requirements for diploma or certification; (2) have fulfilled their financial obligations, and (3) meet other conditions, established by the Department of Educaiton, which meet the standards of clarity, reasonableness and justifiability." "A high school may revoke a student's privilege of participating in the commencement exercises after determining that a Chapter 8-19 offense was committed by the student during fourth quarter of the school year, as follows: Class A or B offense: First offense during the fourth quarter: revocation of privilege. Class C or D offense: (a) First offense during the fourth quarter: warning that the privilege will be revoked if a second offense is committed; (b) second offense during the fourth quarter: revocation of privilege." Kalaheo High School will hold to the above Chapter 8-19 Standards of Conduct and revoke a student's privilege of participation at commencement exer-




